



Why Potassium Iodide?

Your body doesn't distinguish between stable iodine and radioactive iodine isotopes.

Process Map How The Body Uses Iodine




Cause Map Chernobyl Reactor Accident High Level

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Experts found that the most significant source of radioactive iodine following the Chernobyl accident was locally produced milk. People didn't understand the health risk imposed by milk produced by cows eating grass contaminated by fission products. If people had stopped drinking local milk for a few months following the accident it would have significantly decreased the epidemic of thyroid cancer.
